


Preamble

Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Committee (SAADC) is proud of being the main pillar to protect the sport and its integrity from the threats of doping in Saudi Arabia.

Achievements over the past year have included strengthening partnerships by establishing relationships with key international, national and regional organizations, expanding the range of education and prevention, and continuing the development of Anti-Doping operations.

The Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Committee with its board of directors and staff is pleased to share this report including a summary of the SAADC'S achievements and activities covering the period between 06/06/2016 and 05/05/2017. This report reviews the events rrelated to SAADC's key areas of focus; Education, Training, and Testing.





About SAADC

The Saudi Anti-Doping Committee prides on its role in protecting athletes from the dangers of doping, and in disseminating the culture of clean sport as well. SAADC is the competent authority responsible for protecting the integrity of sport from the threat of doping in Saudi Arabia.

The Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Committee (SAADC) is a National Anti-Doping Organization in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. It was created in accordance with the WADA Code and the UNESCO Anti-Doping convention. It was charged with the implementation of a national anti-doping program and all anti-doping related matters at local, regional, continental and international levels.

Hence SAADC has accepted and implemented the World Anti-Doping Code in conformance with its responsibilities under the Code, and in furtherance of SAADC continuing efforts to eradicate doping in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

SAADC is a consultative, legislative and executive committee, linked with the Saudi Arabian Olympic Committee. It is an independent body with legal personality, and is a reference to all anti-doping matters nationwide in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. It is the sole authority to represent Saudi Arabia at the International anti-doping events. SAADC operates within the policies of the General Sports Authority.



SAADC's Establishment & Code Issuance

- An interim Board of Directors was formed on 05/05/1425 H. (23/06/2004) to determine the work mechanism, issue legal and organizational set of rules, and to implement a preliminary and concise national anti-doping program that would include (Training, Awareness, and Testing) for the period of 2004 -2007.
- Between 2007-2009 it was the start of implementing the Doping Control Program.
- After issuance of the WADA Code and the “Saudi Anti-Doping Rules in Sports” in 2009, SAADC’s Board was re-formed by the decision No. 810 in 14/06/1430 H. (07/06/2009 AD).
- SAADC’s Board of Directors was re-formed after the expiration of its legal term by the decision No. 6741 on 12/05/1434 H. (24/03/2013)
- New board of directors was formed on 01/01/2017.
- After issuance of the WADA Code and the “Saudi Anti-Doping Rules in Sports” in 2009, SAADC’s Board was re-formed by the decision No. 810 in 14/06/1430 H. (07/06/2009 AD).
- SAADC’s Board of Directors was re-formed after the expiration of its legal term by the decision No. 6741 on 12/05/1434 H. (24/03/2013)
- New board of directors was formed on 01/01/2017.
- In accordance with the international conventions and the Code, the WADA-Accredited “Saudi Anti-Doping Rules in Sports” was issued on 09/02/2009, and then the updated one on 01/01/2015 and lastly, the 2nd updated version of the Saudi Anti-Doping Rules in Sport on 01/04/2017.

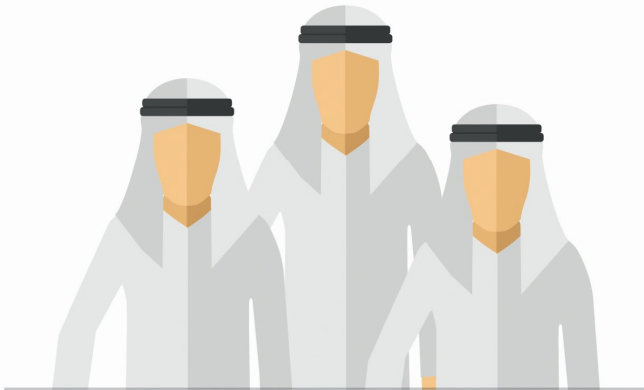
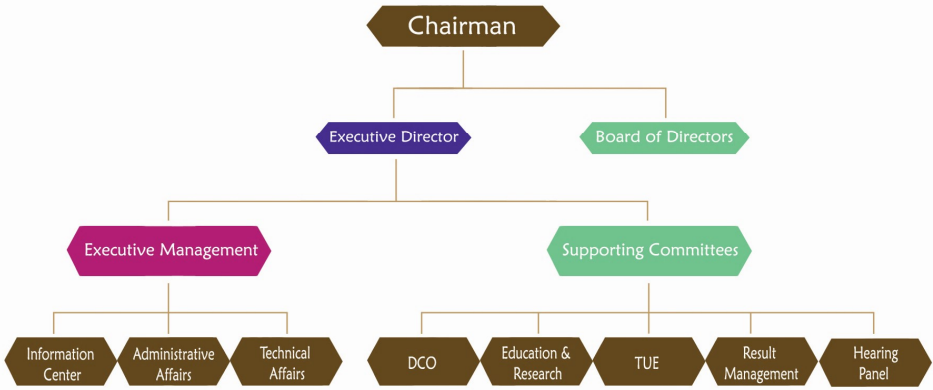


Mission

SAADC's Supporting Committees

1 - The Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Hearing Panel

It is an ad-hoc subcommittee which looks into cases violating the anti doping rules and regulations. It imposes sanctions and penalties against violators. It is an independent committee consisting of members who do not belong to any sport federations or associations.

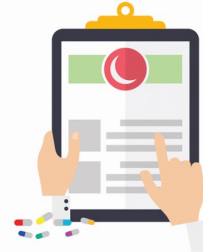
Its formation details as follows:

- 1) A chair.
- 2) Two Vice-Chairs, each of whom shall be legal practitioners of not less than five years standing.
- 3) Three medical practitioners of not less than five years standing.
- 4) Three additional members, each of whom shall be, or has previously been, a sports administrator or an Athlete.
- 5) Each panel member shall serve a term of four years.
- 6) The start of their work from 01/01/2015.



2 - Therapeutic Use Exemption Committee

It is responsible for issuing exemptions for athletes to use, for medical treatment, drugs and medicine that contain substances prohibited in sport. It is an independent body consisting of four medical consultants of different specialties. Each panel member shall serve a term of four years. The last term started from 01/02/2017.



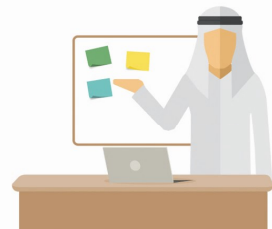
3 - Doping Control Committee

A Committee administratively linked with the executive management has been created to oversee the Doping Control officials and organize their works. It is considered the link between the DCOs and the Board of Directors. It consists of 6 members experienced in the field of testing. Members shall serve a 2-year term, that has started from 01/02/2017.



4 - Research & Education Committee

It is the committee that is concerned with the scientific affairs, studies and researches. It serves as the SAADC's scientific reference in obtaining the required information about the prohibited substances and methods in sport in addition to other scientific affairs, researches and studies. It consists of three academics having experience in the field of scientific research. Each member shall serve a term of four years, that started from 01/02/2017.





SAADC's Contribution to the International Requirements



The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) is the main reference for anti-doping issues all over the world. Current president: Sir Craig Reedie His term started on 01/01/2014 for four years.

● Copenhagen Declaration & Issuance of the WADA Code 2003

The Saudi Arabian government adopted them by the Royal Decree No. 205 dated 25/07/1425 H. (22/09/2003).

● The UNESCO Anti Doping Convention 2005

The government of Saudi Arabia signed the Convention under Royal Decree No. 350 dated 23/11/1428 H. corresponding to 03/12/2007.

● The Kingdom's regional, continental, and international position

- Saudi Arabia was elected as WADA Foundation Board Member for 3-year term started on 01/01/2015 to the end of 2017, out of 4 seats for Asia. The Foundation Board is WADA's supreme decision-making body.
- It was also elected as Member of WADA Experts Group (total of 8 groups).
- Saudi Arabia chairs the UNESCO Anti-Doping Conference of Parties till the end of 2017.
- Saudi Arabia is a member of OCA Medical & Anti-Doping Committee and Member of the West Asian Federation Medical Committee.

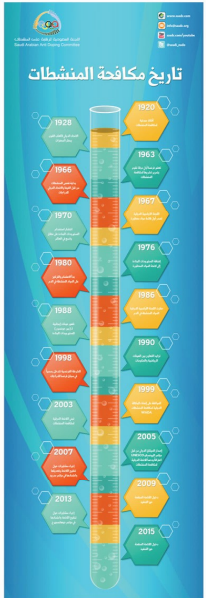

كيف يجري فحص الرياضيين؟

1. يتم اختيار الرياضيين للفحص بشكل عشوائي أو بناءً على معايير محددة.
2. يتم إبلاغ الرياضي بالوقت والمكان المحدد للفحص.
3. يقوم الرياضي بإعطاء عينة البول في مكان محدد.
4. يتم فحص العينة في مختبر معتمد.
5. يتم إرسال النتائج إلى اللجنة الرباعية للتحقق.
6. في حالة اكتشاف انتهاك، يتم إبلاغ الرياضي وتطبيق العقوبة.
7. يتم إجراء جلسة استماع للرياضي قبل إصدار العقوبة النهائية.

Introduction

By the virtue of the approval granted by the Council of Arab Youth and Sport Ministers in its (39) session on 08/08/1437 H. (15/05/2016) to hold Arab symposium tackling the effects of doping on the athletes and their health, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia hosted the Arab Anti-Doping Symposium 2017 in Riyadh from 20-21/06/1438 H. (19-20/03/2017) under the patronage of the General Sports Authority and the participation of the Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Committee and the General Secretariat of the Arab League.

Objectives

The major focus of the symposium was centered on the implementation of the Wada Code, and the Saudi experience in the fight against doping in sport, and also the Anti-Doping Arab 5-year Plan. The rest topics of the agenda included the following:

Recommendations of the Arab Anti-Doping Symposium

19 - 20 March 2017

Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

Under the auspices of HRH Abdullah Bin Mosaad Bin Abdulaziz , General Sport Authority and Chairman of Saudi Arabia Olympic Committee ,
Chaired by Dr. Mohammed Saleh Al-Konbaz , WADA Foundation Board Member, President of the UNESCO Convention Against Doping in Sport and President of the Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Committee (SAADC)

All participants to the Arab Anti-Doping Symposium here in Riyadh having examined, discussed and fully considered the documents and presentations from the meeting, wish to adopt the following recommendations:

1. Respect the messages given by HRH Abdullah Bin Mosaad Bin Abdulaziz, President, General Sports Authority and Chairman of Saudi Arabia Olympic Committee, and Mr. Olivier Niggli, Director General of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and their strong commitment to continue to work together to protect the right of clean athlete, with a particular focus on how we cooperate together to strengthen the anti-doping system for Arab region.
2. Appreciate the reports and presentations given by guest speakers on the related Symposium topics and the recent development of anti-doping policy and activities in each of the organizations, in particular, the report presented by the representatives of the public authorities and sport movement of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, namely the Saudi Arabian Anti-Doping Committee (SAADC), Saudi Food and Drug Agency (SADF), National Anti-Narcotics Committee (MAMC), General Directorate for Narcotics Control (GDNC), especially on the Arab sport and anti-doping history, Dietary Supplements Control , Confrontation and security aspect of the fight against Narcotics.
3. Appreciate and commend the work of the Symposium chaired by Dr. Mohammed Saleh Al-Konbaz and his team for preparing and organising the meeting effectively and efficiently.



4. Appreciate the support and presentations given by WADA, UNESCO, Anti-Doping Laboratory Qatar, Africa Zone 1 RADO, West Asia RADO, GCCY RADO and recognise the importance of the continued promotion and cooperation among all to achieve the goals of effective anti-doping policies, especially for the Code compliance monitoring program, the implementation of the International Convention against Doping in Sport, Laboratory Communication with ADOs, promotion of the RADO programs and the cooperation among RADOs for the regional capacity building in the Arab Region.

5. Appreciate the donation by HRH Prince Abdullah bin Mosaad Al Saud , USD 100,000 to the WADA Special Investigation Fund, and USD 50,000 to the UNESCO Fund for the elimination of doping in sport.

6. Agree that all participants recognise how partnerships among stakeholders can facilitate effective anti-doping programs that protect clean sport and clean athletes in Arabic region for the future, especially in the framed conditions in place through the cooperation development in the Arabic countries shall undertake the following actions:

- 6 -1 Agree to host the Arab Anti-Doping Forum to further develop the anti-doping policy and programs in Arabic countries as the successful model of partnership and cooperation for the fight against doping. The forum should be hosted at least every two years.
- 6 -2 Promote the regional cooperation through the partnership with WADA, NADOs, RADOs, UNESCO and other key stakeholders.
- 6 -3 Encourage the cooperation with the RADO program enhanced by WADA.
- 6 -4 Encourage the engagement of the Arab Anti-doping experts through participation in the activities of the Arab Anti-Doping Forum.
- 6 -5 The attendees delegated Dr. Saleh Konbaz and Abdul Aziz Almasaed from Saudi Arabia, Dr. Kamal Hadidi from Jordan and Kazuhiro Hayashi, WADA Asia/Oceania Regional Office to liaison with Arab Sports Ministers on the recognition of the Forum and draft all the related documents for its establishment.

7. The Arab region appreciates the assistance from the World Anti-Doping Agency and fully supports the strengthening of WADA.

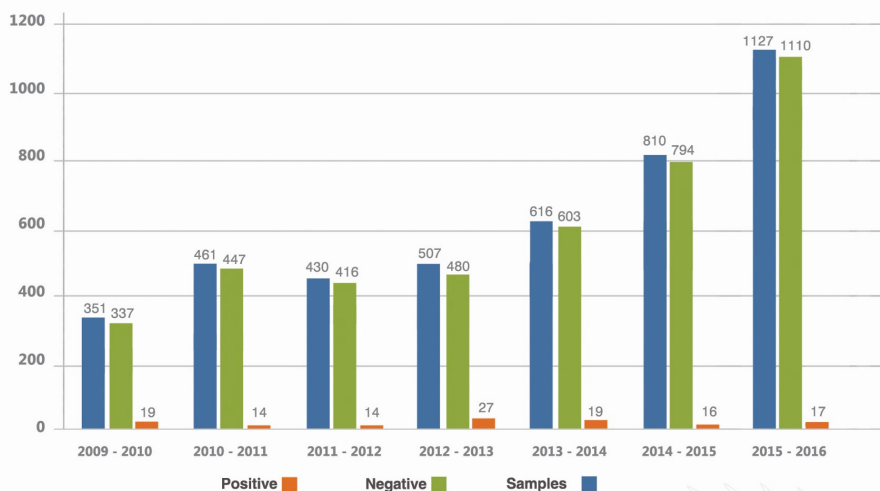

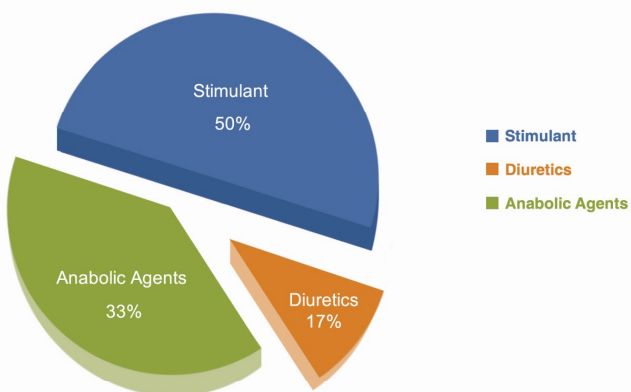

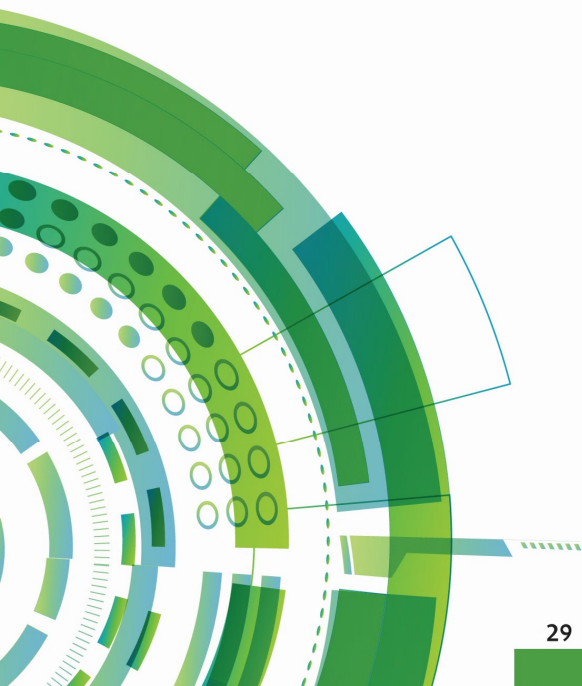
